Helping wildlife in Droitwich

The Trust's Natural Networks project, which provides advice on nature improvements for councils, charities and businesses, is working with Droitwich Town Council to improve two sites for wildlife.

Copcut Park and Spring Meadow have been put forward by the Town Council to receive a free Biodiversity Enhancement Assessment (BEA). The findings of this should lead to habitat enhancements across the two sites.

Potential enhancements that may be seen in the coming months include tree planting, wildflower meadow creation, spring blub planting and the installation of bird and bat boxes, plus insect hotel benches.
