Loss of habitat through land use change and agricultural intensification threatens many species. Recently brown hares appear less common on farmland; loss of hedgerows affects hedgehogs; less connectivity affects dormice, bats and others.

There is approximately one wood mouse for every two people in the UK!

Modern threats to badgers, foxes, hedgehogs, polecats and deer include being casualties on the roads
