**There are an estimated 285 million wild mammals in Britain**

**When a fox wants to get through a small gap, it puts its nose in first. If its whiskers touch the sides of the hole, the fox knows that its body won't fit through.**

**British mammals all play a vital role in maintaining a balanced ecosystem, on land, in water and air**

**Rabbits can achieve speeds of up to 50 miles per hour!**

**The hedgehog has about 5-6000 spines on its back**

**There is approximately one wood mouse for every two people in the UK!**

**Loss of habitat through land use change and agricultural intensification threatens many species. Recently brown hares appear less common on farmland; loss of hedgerows affects hedgehogs; less connectivity affects dormice, bats and others.**

**Modern threats to badgers, foxes, hedgehogs, polecats and deer include being casualties on the roads**
