



Bees see the world very differently to humans


Bees see in ultra violet (UV)

Bees have got 5 eyes.
2 large eyes on the side
of their head.
3 smaller eyes on top!

The large eye of a bee
can contain over 4000
lenses, all hexagon-
shaped

Because bees see in
UV this means they
can't see the colour red

A flower can look really different when a bee sees it, even having
lines guiding it to the nectar.



Bees need flowers to survive.



Make your own colour wheel using flowers from the garden.


Look out for bees. Do they seem to have a favourite colour?
