Natural Networks

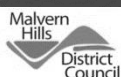
Your local area could soon be getting a wildlife boost thanks to the Natural Networks grants and advice scheme – a partnership between Worcestershire Wildlife Trust and Worcestershire County Council. By identifying project sites and providing surveys and advice, the scheme aims to increase the corridors of wildlife habitats between existing natural sites.

Most works are expected to start this autumn, with plans and improvements that include tree and wildflower meadow planting, path improvements, spring bulb planting, bug hotels, benches, raised beds, bird and bat box installation, natural hedgerows and more. By improving these habitats we hope to see an influx of our pollinators, birds, bats and mammals. Projects are happening across Worcester, Droitwich and further afield.

In Droitwich, for example, work is taking place at Spring Meadow and Copcut Park to enhance the habitat for wildlife and to provide enjoyable outdoor spaces for the community. Councillor Mrs Bowden, Chairman of the Droitwich Spa Town Council Community and Amenities Committee said "Droitwich Spa Town Council has benefitted from the maximum eligible grant towards this project. We are proud of the benefits and improvements that this opportunity will bring for these Community Green Space assets. Care for the environment and supporting our wildlife remain key priorities."
